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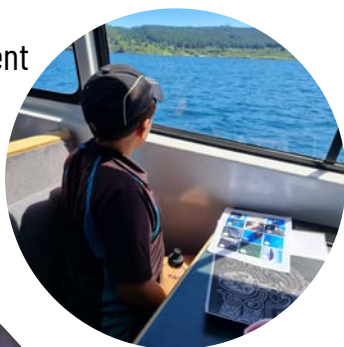


PROGRAMME OUTLINE

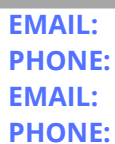

Road Accident	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Disclose to teachers prior to their visit that on the marina is a road used regularly by vehicles.• Teachers must ensure students walk to and from the boats in an orderly and safe manner using footpaths and designated crossing points.• Teachers are solely responsible for students outside of the boats.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For minor injuries: First aid kit located on the boats and readily available.• Current first aid certificates held by key contact and full time staff.• For major injuries: Phone 111.
Use of boat equipment and resources	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Disclose to students and teachers that they may be handling equipment that if used incorrectly could cause: Cuts: e.g. scissors, sharp point injury: e.g. fish hooks.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For minor injuries: First Aid Kit located on the boats and readily available.• Current first aid certificates held by key contact and full time staff.• For major injuries: Phone 111.
Student specific ailment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Individual medical needs are to be discussed by class teachers prior to the boat visit if necessary.• The class teacher is responsible for the specific medical needs of the student.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For minor injuries: First Aid Kit located on the boats and readily available.• Current first aid certificates held by key contact and full time staff.• For major injuries: Phone 111.
Lost or missing student	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Teachers are to disclose to students that there may be members of the public within the vicinity of the boat.• Ensure the suggested ratio is clear to visiting teachers and that an adult is assigned to student groups.• The class teacher is responsible for the overall safety of all students.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Teacher to do a register check.• Crew and teaching staff to search boat.• Contact Police if necessary.
Evacuation of boat	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Teachers are to inform students and adult helpers at the start of the visit the procedure in the event of an emergency, instructions will be given by the skipper, and must be followed.• Class teachers must bring a class list/roll.• Disclose that the students must comply with all instructions given by skipper and crew.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow practiced evacuation procedure.• Evacuate out to the instructions given by Skipper and Crew.
Going to the toilet/leaving the group	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Disclose to students and teachers that any student going to the toilet or leaving the main group for whatever reason must tell an adult that is with the school group, not a Chris Jolly staff member.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Visiting school staff have prior warning and know at all times where their students are.
Uneven surfaces such as steps, floor surfaces, slopes, gangplanks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Crew will warn visitors of these potential hazards.• Constant checking of light levels by staff.• Crew will assist where possible for disabled users and wheelchairs.• All stairs have handrails. Students and teachers are to take care to avoid slips and trips by ensuring they walk, not run and are mindful of other visitors.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• For minor injuries: First Aid Kit located on the boats and readily available.• Current first aid certificates held by key contact and full time staff.• For major injuries: Phone 111.
Covid-19	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Visiting school staff to communicate with key contacts in a change of Covid level.• Surfaces to be sanitised after each cruise• Hand sanitiser to be made available• Personal hygiene the responsibility of each individual and teacher.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Follow the advice from the government in the alert levels.• Contact tracing.
